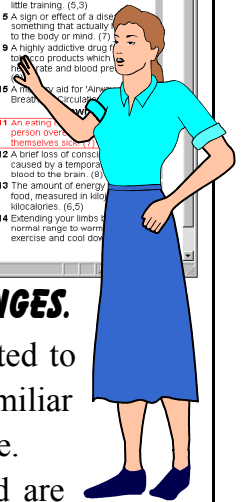
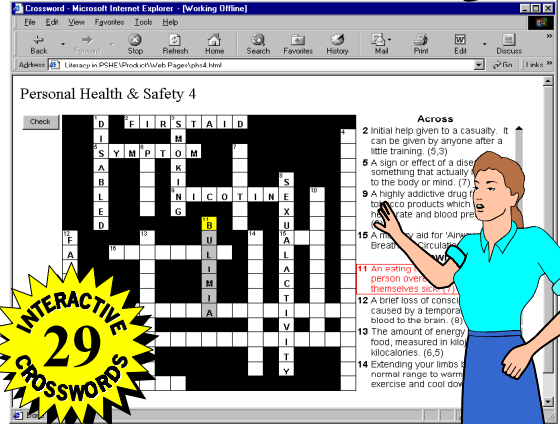



Literacy in PSHE is structured into 8 major themes covering a full range of topics - providing over 100 crosswords, wordsearches and word exercises.

Solutions to the crosswords and wordsearches are also provided. Differentiate by allowing the pupils to choose a crossword or wordsearch - the associated word exercises ensure a similar outcome. The crossword support sheets (see opposite) provide a differentiated intermediate task level between a crossword and a wordsearch.
